Faubion Middle School serves a diverse population of approximately 1,300 students, 37% of whom identify as Hispanic, 15% of whom identify as African American, and 41% of whom are classified as economically disadvantaged.

With 220 singers in the choral program, Bella Voce is an auditioned chorus with 52 girls that closely reflects the diversity of the Faubion community. With a strong history of success at Solo Festival, UIL Concert & Sight-reading Evaluation, and All-Region Choir, Bella Voce exemplifies the essence of hard work. Many of the singers are pillars not only in the choir family, but also in athletics, theatre, Student Council, and National Junior Honor Society.

Liz Turner, aka "Mama T", is in her 29th year of teaching young singers, 22nd year of teaching choir, and her seventh year at Faubion. Previously, she was the choir director at Haggard Middle School, Shepton

High School, and Plano West Senior High School in Plano, Texas. She is a current member of Texas Music Educators Association, American Choral Directors Association, and Texas Choral Directors Association and serves TMEA Region 24 as the MS/JHS Chair. Mrs. Turner is the 2023 Teacher of the Year for Faubion Middle School.

Mrs. Turner earned her Bachelor of Music Education from Texas Christian University (Magna Cum Laude) in 1994, where she was a member and officer of Mu Phi Epsilon, Texas Music Educators Conference (College Student Vice President), and Music Educators Organization. She was the recipient of the Howard T. Walsh Scholarship, the Texas Choral Directors Association Dr. Ruth Whitlock Scholarship, Golden Key National Honor Society, Mortar Board, Pi Kappa Lambda, National Dean's List, and the TCU College of Fine Arts and Communication Dean's List every semester.
